ORDINANCE 15-4661
JAIL COSTS

AN ORDINANCE ALLOWING FOR COSTS INCURRED BY THE CITY IN THE IMPRISONMENT OF PERSONS FOUND GUILTY, PLEAD GUILTY, OR PLEAD NO CONTEST, TO BE ASSESSED TO THE DEFENDANT FOR THE CITY OF CHERRYVALE, KANSAS.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF CHERRYVALE, KANSAS, THAT:

The Code of the City of Cherryvale is hereby amended by adding a section which reads as follows:

9-115. Jail Costs.

In addition to the costs assessed against the defendant as otherwise provided by ordinance of the City, the judge of the municipal court is hereby authorized to assess against a criminal defendant who has been found "guilty," entered a plea of "guilty," or a plea of "nolo contendere," the costs of incarceration of such defendant in the amount of per diem costs to the City of such incarceration.

Council Member Wagoner expressed interest in a workforce assessment and using that as a tool to partner with the local education institutions on training/retraining to provide our workforce with more marketable skills. Wagoner also stated that we need to improve the infrastructure in the county, and develop more shelter ready sites.
