RESOLUTION 14-17 SALES TAX FOR FUNDING CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS

A RESOLUTION TO SUBMIT TO THE QUALIFIED ELECTORS OF THE CITY OF CHERRYVALE THE PROPOSITION OF LEVYING A THREE-FOURTHS OF ONE PERCENT (0.75%) CITYWIDE RISTALERS' SALES TAX IN THE CITY OF CHERRYVALE, FOR THE PURPOSE OF PUNDING CAPITAL IMPROYEMENTS.

WHEREAS, K.S.A. 12-187 et seq, as amended, authorizes the Governing Body to submit to qualified electors of the city the question of lovying a retailers' sales tax, such tax to be collected by the State Department of Revenue with the revenue therefrom returned to this city; and,

WHEREAS, the majority of qualified electors of the City of Cherryvale at a general election on April 5, 2011 voted in favor of a three-fourths percent (0.75%) retailer's sales tax for the purpose of capital improvements; and

WHEREAS, the governing body of the City of Cherryvale has determined that it is a priority to protect and improve the City's aging infrastructure and additional revenue is needed for the improvement of structs, storm water drainage, and other capital improvements.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF CHERRYVALE, KANSAS:

SECTION 1. A special question shall be held in the manner prescribed by law on the 7th day of April, 2015 for the purpose of submitting to the qualified electors of the City of Cherryvale, the question of lovelying the three-fearths of one percent (75%) retailers' sales tax in the City of Cherryvale. The tax shall be allocated to finance eapital improvement projects within the City of Cherryvale. The three-fourths of one percent (75%) will take effect on the 1st day of Ociober, 2015, if approved by a majority of the electors voting thereon. The tax shall be fredetive for a period of four (4) years from and after the first day of Ociober 2015. The proposition shall appear as follows:

Shall the following be adopted?

Shall the City of Chernycele, Kansas be authorized to impose a three-fourths of one percent (0.75%) city wide retailers' sales tax, which shall be used to finance capital improvements, to take effect October 1, 2015, and continue in full force and effect for a period of four (4) years from and after its commencement, all pursuant to the provisions of K.S.A. 12-187 et seq., as amended?

SECTION 2. If approved by a majority of electors voting thereon, such tax shall be subject to all applicable state laws and administrative rules and regulations of the Kansas Department of

Revenue. The services of the Department of Revenue shall be utilized to administer, enforce and collect such tax.

SECTION 3. The city clerk and county election officer shall cause notices to be published of this special question election, as provided by law.

A RESOLUTION TO SUBMIT TO THE QUALIFIED ELECTORS OF THE CITY OF CHERRYVALE THE PROPOSITION OF LEVYING A ONE-FOURTH OF ONE PERCENT (0.25%) CITYMOR REFLALERS SALES TAX IN THE CITY OF CHERRYVALE, FOR THE PURPOSE OF FUNDING RECREATIONAL AMENITIES.

WHERRAS, K.S.A. 12-187 et seq, as amended, authorizes the Governing Body to submit to qualified electors of the city the question of levyting a retailers' safes tax, such tax to be collected by the State Department of Revenue with the revenue therefrom returned to this city, and,

WHEREAN, the governing body of the City of Cherryvale wishes to further fund the operation and maintenance of existing recreational amenities through a sales tax; and,

WHEREAS, remaining revenues may be used to fund additional amenities or programs not currently available to Cherryvale residents.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF CHERRYVALE, KANSAS:

SECTION 1. A special question shall be held in the manner prescribed by law on the 7th day of April, 2015 for the purpose of submitting to the qualified electors of the City of Cherryvale, the question of levying the one-found of one percent (278%) retailers' sales tax in the City of Cherryvale. The tax shall be allocated to finance recreational amenities within the City of Cherryvale. The one-fourth of one percent (25%) will take effect on the 1st day of October, 2015, if approved by a majority of the electors voting thereon. The tax shall be effective for a period of four (4) years from and after the first day of October 2015. The proposition shall appear as follows:

Shall the following be adopted?

Shall the City of Cherryvale, Kansas be authorized to impose a one-fourth of one percent (0.25%) city wide retailers' sales tax, which shall be used to finance recreational amentities, to take effect Orbother 1, 2015, and continue in full force and offect for a period of four (4) years from and after its commencement, all pursuant to the provisions of K.S.A. 12-187 et seq., as amended?

WHEREAS, the City of Cherryvale has a commitment to provide quality water to all of its customers; and

WHEREAS, the City of Cherryvale Water Distribution System will need upgrades and repairs; and

WHEREAS, a water rate analysis was performed by the City Administrator and presented to the Governing Body as required by City Code.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF CHERRYVALE, KANSAS, THAT:

SECTION 1. WATER RATES. Water rates are hereby changed to \$13.00 for a base service charge and a unit charge of \$8.57 per 1,000 gallons of water consumed. The charge for bulk water shall not exceed the rate of \$10.00 per 1,000 gallons of water consumed.

SECTION 2. RURAL WATER RATES. Rural water rates are hereby changed to \$13.00 for a base service charge and a unit charge of \$10.98 per 1,000 gallons of water consumed.

SECTION 3. EFFECTIVE. This ordinance shall be effective after passage and publication is complete and for all meter readings beginning December 1, 2014.

SECTION 4. REVIEW. The City Administrator or his or her designee shall continue to perform a rate review on a yearly basis and present his or her findings to the Governing Body at the last Council Meeting in November.

SECTION 5. REPEAL. Ordinance No. 12-4629 is hereby repealed.

ORDINANCE 14-4658 SEWED DATES

AN ORDINANCE SETTING SEWER RATES FOR SERVICES PROVIDED BY THE CITY OF CHERRYVALE, KANSAS

WHEREAS, the City of Cherryvale has a commitment to provide quality sanitary sewer service to all of its customers; and

WHEREAS, the City of Cherryvale Sanitary Sewer Distribution System is in need of upgrades and renairs; and

WHEREAS, a sewer rate analysis was performed by the City Administrator and presented to the Governing Body as required by City Code.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF CHERRYVALE, KANSAS, THAT:

SECTION 1. SEWER RATES. Sewer rates are hereby changed to \$7.95 for a base service charge and a unit charge of \$3.65 per 1,000 gallons of water consumed based on an average of the October, November and December water consumption.

SECTION 2. RURAL SEWER RATES. The rates for properties located outside of the Cherryvale city limits shall be \$11.93 for a base service fee and a unit charge of \$5.48 per 1,000 gallous of water consumed, based on an average of the October, Nevember and December water consumption.

SECTION 3. EFFECTIVE. This ordinance shall be effective after passage and publication is complete and for all meter readings beginning December 1, 2014.

SECTION 4. REVIEW. The City Administrator or his or her designee shall continue to perform a rate review on a yearly basis and present his or her findings to the Governing Body at the last Council Meeting in November.

SECTION 5. REPEAL, Ordinance No. 10-4600 is hereby repealed.
