RESOLUTION 15-4 FAIR HOUSING PROCLAMATION

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF CHERRYVALE, KANSAS PROCLAIMING THE MONTH OF APRIL AS FAIR HOUSING MONTH.

WHEREAS, the Congress of the United States passed the Civil Rights Act of 1968, of which Title VIII doclared that the law of the land would now guarantee the rights of equal hotzsing opportunity; and

WHEREAS, the City is committed to the mission and intent of Congress to provide fair and equal liousing opportunities for all, and today, many realty companies and associations support fair housing laws; and

WHEREAS, the Fair Housing groups and the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development have, over the years, received thousands of complaints of alleged Blegal housing discrimination and found too many that have proved upon investigation to be violations of the fair housing fave; and

WHEREAS, equal housing opportunity is a condition of lift in our city that can and should be achieved.
