CITY COUNCIL ACTION REPORT

Subject: 2011 Employee Health & Dental Insurance

Guest: None

Background: The City received our health insurance renewal with Preferred Health Systems with a 19.6% increase. As a result, the City's benefits consultant, Mike Keller of Hardman Benefit Plans, requested quotes for similar plans from other insurance companies, none of which were competitive. Because the City's existing health plan is unaffordable for 2011, the Benefits Committee analyzed other plans offering varying levels of employee coverage.

The Benefits Committee is proposing the following:

- Change to a Preferred Health Systems PPO SA1000 Health Insurance Plan. This plan has an increase in premium of 15.7%, but begins a trend toward a more consumer driven health plan. Under the SA1000 plan, name brand Rx drugs, specialist, urgent care, ambulance, and emergency room visits are subject to the policyholder's deductible. Out-of-pocket maximums are lower on this plan, but specialized services cost the policyholder more initially until the \$1,000 deductible is reached. This plan encourages employees to be more involved in the costs associated with their healthcare. In order to keep the plan affordable for employees, the increase in premium would be funded by the City with the intention of moving toward a plan that is more sustainable in the long term.
- Accept Blue Cross/Blue Shield of Kansas' renewal proposal to provide the City's employee dental insurance. The renewal proposal includes a 29.7% increase due to frequently incurred and paid claims. The Benefits Committee feels that the plan is still reasonable for the benefits provided and employees are obviously using it. The Benefits Committee recommends renewing it, with employees funding the increase in premium.

Financial Consideration: The total cost will vary, depending upon each employee's coverage selected. If plans are selected as anticipated, the employer health insurance contribution will increase by approximately \$16,000 for the remainder of 2011. Dental insurance increases will be borne by the employee. Remaining funds in the 2011 Budget will be sufficient to cover health insurance costs, due to the elimination of the 3% COLA raise.

Legal Consideration: None.

Policy Consideration: The City of Cherryvale should ensure its health and dental insurance benefits are affordable to all employees while being financially responsible.

Recommendation: Approve the Benefits Committee's recommendation and authorize execution of agreements with Preferred Health Systems and Blue Cross/Blue Shield.

Subject: EMC Insurance Renewal

Guest: None

Background: City staff has reviewed the City's property, liability, inland marine, and automobile insurance with our insurance agent to ensure that the City has adequate coverage and the City has received a quote for the policy's annual renewal.

The 2010 EMC insurance renewal premium was \$27,811.00, which was an increase of \$1,507.00 over the previous year. The 2011 EMC insurance renewal premium quote is \$28,531.00, which reflects an increase of \$720.00. The majority of the quoted increase is due to the addition of vehicle and equipment replacement in the Public Works Department. The renewal premium falls within budgeted amounts for 2011.

Financial Consideration: The premium of \$28,531.00 is within 2011 budgeted amounts.

Legal Consideration: None.

Policy Consideration: It is important that the City's insurance policies cover its assets and potential liabilities.

Subject: Unsafe & Dangerous Structures: Resolution 11-12, 11-13, & 11-14

Guest: None

Background: City ordinance requires the City Council to have a hearing and make a determination whether a structure is dangerous or unsafe. If a structure is found to be unsafe or dangerous, the City Council can set a timeline for its removal. If the property owner refuses to remove the structure, the City may demolish the structure and assess the costs to the property owner.

The owners of the properties addressed in Resolution 11-12, 11-13 & 11-14 were sent courtesy notification that their properties are on the City's condemnation list and they must be repaired or removed. The letter stated that if appropriate action was not taken, the City would be forced to begin condemnation hearings. These resolutions set a condemnation hearing date of May 2, 2011.

Financial Consideration: If the City is Up to approximately \$15,000.

Legal Consideration: Continue to follow local ordinances and Kansas Statutes that address the proper legal proceedings and considerations for condemnation and removal of these structures.

Policy Consideration: The Council has expressed a desire to remove dangerous and unsafe structures citywide.

Subject: Resolution No. 11-15: Support for Safe Routes to Schools Application for Phase I Funding

Guest: None

Background: Safe Routes to Schools (SRTS) is a program of the Kansas Department of Transportation, with funding from the Federal Highway Administration. The program provides reimbursement to local governments, school districts and non-profit associations for infrastructure, programs, and activities which make walking and bicycling to school a safe, healthy, and fun routine.

The SRTS Program is laid out in two phases. The City of Cherryvale plans to submit an application for Phase 1 funding, which provides up to \$15,000 to create a Safe Routes to School Plan. This plan outlines the City's approach to offering a comprehensive program combining five components; engineering, education, enforcement, encouragement, and evaluation.

The City is working with consultant Landworks Studio to develop an application for Phase 1 Plan funding. Resolution 11-15 formally provides support and eligibility to submit an application on behalf of the City of Cherryvale. A successful Phase 1 grant application will allow us to complete a plan to submit for Phase 2 construction funding.

Financial Consideration: None.

Legal Consideration: The City of Cherryvale has legal authority to apply for, receive, and administer federal and state funding.

Policy Consideration: The City of Cherryvale desires to promote and create safe routes to schools through educational and infrastructure improvements.

Recommendation: Adopt Resolution 11-15.

RESOLUTION NO. 11-15

A RESOLUTION DECLARING THE ELIGIBILITY OF THE CITY OF CHERRYVALE TO SUBMIT AN APPLICATION TO THE KANSAS DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION FOR USE OF SAFE ROUTES TO SCHOOLS FUNDS SET FORTH BY SAFETEA-LU FOR THE CHERRYVALE PHASE 1 SRTS PLAN IN THE CITY OF CHERRYVALE AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO SIGN THIS APPLICATION.

WHEREAS, the City of Cherryvale, Kansas, has the legal authority to apply for, receive, and administer federal, state, and other monies through Home Rule Power under the Constitution of the State of Kansas and authorized by K.S.A. 12-1662, regarding the expenditure of federal aid to public agencies; and

WHEREAS, the City of Cherryvale, Kansas, desires to submit an application to the Kansas Department of Transportation for Safe Routes to Schools funds set forth by SAFETEA-LU; and

WHEREAS, the City of Cherryvale, Kansas, is participating in the Kansas Department of Transportation's Safe Routes to Schools program set forth by SAFETEA-LU; and

WHEREAS, Federal monies are available under a Safe Routes to Schools program set forth by SAFETEA-LU, administered by the State of Kansas, Department of Transportation, for the purpose of creating safer routes to schools in Kansas; and

WHEREAS, after appropriate public input and due consideration, the Governing Body of City of Cherryvale, Kansas has recommended that an application be submitted to the State of Kansas for the Cherryvale Phase 1 SRTS Plan.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF CHERRYVALE, KANSAS:

SECTION 1. That the City of Cherryvale, Kansas, does hereby authorize Mayor to submit an application to the Kansas Department of Transportation for Safe Routes to Schools program funds set forth by SAFETEA-LU on behalf of the citizens of the City of Cherryvale, Kansas.

SECTION 2. That the City of Cherryvale, Kansas, hereby assures the Kansas Department of Transportation that sufficient funding for the Cherryvale Phase 1 SRTS Plan is available, as the Safe Routes to Schools Program is a reimbursement program.

SECTION 3. That the City of Cherryvale, Kansas, hereby assures the Kansas Department of Transportation that sufficient funding for the operation and maintenance of the Cherryvale Phase 1 SRTS Plan will be available for the life of the project.

SECTION 4. That the City of Cherryvale, Kansas, hereby assures the Kansas Department of Transportation that the City of Cherryvale, Kansas will have title or permanent easement to the Cherryvale Phase 1 SRTS Plan by the time of project letting, if necessary.

SECTION 5. That the Mayor of City of Cherryvale Kansas, is authorized to sign the application to the Kansas Department of Transportation for Safe Routes to Schools program funds set forth by SAFETEA-LU on behalf of the citizens of City of Cherryvale, Kansas. The Mayor is also authorized to submit additional information as may be required and act as the official representative of the City of Cherryvale in this and subsequent related activities.

SECTION 6. That the City of Cherryvale, Kansas, hereby assures the Kansas Department of Transportation that the City of Cherryvale, Kansas, is willing and able to, if the Cherryvale Phase 1 SRTS Plan is selected for funding, administer all activities involved with the Cherryvale Phase 1 SRTS Plan.

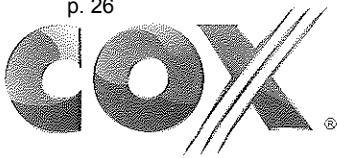

Advanced digital service offerings have required the upgrade of our EAS equipment. That upgraded equipment does not have local access capability.

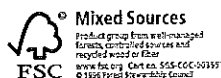
